Regular Agenda Items

4. Approve Change Order from Gillig for CNG Bus Order:

At the April 22, 2020 board meeting the Board approved the purchase of six buses from Gillig and authorized the Executive Director to issue a purchase order to Gillig in an amount not to exceed \$3,214,000. During the prebuild meeting, two options included in the build specifications were deleted, and three options were added. This included the deletion of the CNG fuel gauge and the fuel door lock, as this is included in the standard build. The three options added are a driver barrier, driver dash fans, and the GFI farebox, The overall pre-production meeting changes, including tax resulted in an increase per us of \$24,038.03

5. Transit Cares Act Funding Update:

On March 27, 2020, President Trump signed the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act into law. The Federal Transit Administration (FTA) allocated \$25 billion to recipients of urbanized area and rural are formulas funds. The funding provided at 100-percent federal share, with no local match required. The CARES funding was disbursed through FTA apportionment to the urbanized area (Section 5307) and Rural Formula (Section 5311) was disbursed through FTA to State Agency.

As both an urbanized area (Section 5307) recipient and the rural area (Section 5311) recipient, KCAPTA received CARES Act Funding as a direct recipient from FTA to support the operating cost of the urbanized area public transit system for \$8,932,310 and will receive CARES Act Funding as a sub-recipient from Caltrans.

As previously discussed with the Board, KCAPTA will utilize the 8 million to support the operating cost of the urbanized area public transit system over the next two fiscal years. Caltrans received \$80,730,116 to distribute to eligible 5311 recipients and is disbursing the CARES act fund to 5311 recipients through 3 phases. Caltrans allocated \$25,500,000 to distribute in Phase 1 to eligible recipients based on a formula. KCAPTA's Phase 1 apportionment is \$306,920. Staff is in the process of executing the funding agreement with Caltrans to utilize these funds to support the rural operational costs from January 2020.

Caltrans allocated \$46,230,167 to distribute in Phase 2. These funds will be allocated by region to transit agencies through the Metropolitan Planning Organization (Kings County Association of Governments {KCAG}). Per KCAG's shares calculation, KCAPTA will receive \$542,456. Staff will be evaluating how to utilize these funds to improve the rural transit operation.

Craig Wilson, with MV Transportation, stated that the entire team is working hard to ensure the buses remain clean. There have been no complaints with asking riders to wear masks and social distance.
