STAFF REPORT

3. CONSENT ITEM:

A. Summary Minutes of Regular Meeting May 26, 2021

B. Riders Code of Conduct

In 2017 Staff created a Policy Manual where all of KCPATA's policies are kept; each policy has the same format and is numbered accordingly. Many of our policies mirror the County of Kings policies and other policies are transit specific. Periodically, Staff will review policies to make sure they are up-to-date and reflect our current operating environment.

The Riders Code of Conduct was out-of-date, staff updated the policy to reflect our current operational environment. All of the changes noted in the agenda item are reflected as strikeouts and/or red font within the Riders Code of Conduct Policy to highlight where they occur.

C. Fresno County Rural Transportation Agency Agreement

The Regional Transportation Plan for Fresno County proposes the provision of public transportation service between Laton in Fresno County and Hanford in Kings County and Fresno Medical Transit from Hanford through Laton to the Fresno area hospitals. Fresno County Rural Transit (FCRTA) provides assistance to subsidize Route 14-Laton and Route 17-Fresno. Staff recommends that the Board authorize the Executive Director to sign the contract with FCRTA.

4. AWARD ARCHITECTURAL AND ENGINEERING SERVICE CONTRACT TO RRM DESIGN GROUP (Angie Dow):

On March 26, 2021, KCAPTA released a Request for Proposals (RFP) for Architectural and Engineering Services. The RFP was sent to thirteen (13) Firms. Four (4) proposals were received. Members from the Design Committee and selected staff (Committee) reviewed and scored the four (4) proposals received. On May 17, 2021, the Committee interviewed the top three (3) proposals.

The Committee ranked the proposals as follows:

- 1. RRM Design Group
- 2. Paul Halajian Architects
- 3. Radian Design Group Inc.
- 4. Mangini Associates Inc.

Pursuant to KCAPTA's Procurement Policy, Chapter 4, Section 4.7.9 "Evaluation and Contract Negotiation," staff negotiated the contract terms and prices with the highest rated firm.

RRM Design Group is located in San Luis Obispo and was established in 1974. RRM is a multidisciplinary firm focused on transportation planning, design, and engineering. Their experience includes designing federally funded transit projects such as Manteca Transit Center, Walnut Creek Bart Transit Village, and West Oakland Bart Station Transit-Oriented Development project. Attached to the Board's Agenda is RRM's Proposal.

Staff recommends the Board approve awarding the Architectural and Engineering Services Contract to RRM Design Group in an amount not to exceed one million six hundred ninety-seven thousand six hundred ninety-nine dollars (\$1,697,699).

This project is funded by KCAPTA federal 5307 apportionments and is within our budgeted amount.

Recommendation

Staff recommends the Board Award the Architectural and Engineering Services Contract to RRM Design Group and Authorize the Board Chair to Executed Agreement 2104 in an amount not to exceed \$1,697,698.80.

5. AWARD SOLE SOURCE PURCHASE OF A SOLAR EV CHARGING STATION TO BEAM (Angie Dow):

Included in the Fiscal Year, 2020/21 Capital Budget is to purchase a solar vehicle charging station. This unit's funding comes from Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvements (CMAQ) and State Transit Funds. Originally this unit was to be utilized to charge the MINe vehicle KCAPTA was purchasing. However, the solar array is not large enough to charge the bus.

The City of Avenal has been working on starting a car share program to meet the gaps in public transit services in Avenal. Mobility Development Organization operates a grant-funded project, "microcar." All of the vehicles in the project are 100% electric. If the City of Avenal had access to an electric vehicle charger Mobility Development Organization received authorization to expand their pilot project to include the City of Avenal. Installing this unit in the City of Avenal would be the best alternative use.

Although there are various solar charging panels and battery storage available, they would require design, permitting, construction, and electrical work to install and would be a permanent structure. The EV ARC 2000 is unique with no direct competitors. The EV ARC 2020 is 100% renewable, transportable, off-grid EV charging station. This unit can be deployed in minutes instead of months. It is held in place by gravity-no bolting, no gluing, and no grid connection. There is no permitting, construction, electrical work required to install the unit.

Procurement of the EV ARC 2020 would be classified as a "Sole Source" Procurement. This type of procurement is allowed when the supplies or services are available from only one responsible source, and no other supplies or services will satisfy the requirements of KCAPTA. The summary of what makes the EV ARC 2020 unique is:

- Ballasted steel base pad (no foundations needed for installation) that fits within a standard parking space.
- Zero negative impact on existing parking layout as a vehicle can park on the steel base pad of the unit.
- Patented tracking technology articulates solar array throughout the day, so it has always pointed in the most optimal direction for solar collection.
- Transportable can be relocated if needed.
- 100% made in the USA.

Staff requested a quote from Beam Global for the EV ARC 2020 mobile solar panel electric vehicle charging system with the ClipperCreek Dual Port Control Access and an additional battery pack. The total cost of the unit delivered and set up, including tax, is \$76,253. This amount is \$5,003 over the budget amount, and if approved, an additional Budget Appropriation of \$5,003 would need to be approved.

Funding for the unit would be:

CMAQ = \$46,000STA = \$30,253

Recommendation

Staff recommends the Board approved the Sole Source purchase of the EV ARC 2020 from Beam Global, the additional Budget Appropriation of \$5,003, and authorized the Executive Director to issue a purchase order in an amount not to exceed \$76,253.
